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PRIMARY SCHOOL SPORTS PROGRAMME AWARDS CEREMONY A SUCCESS

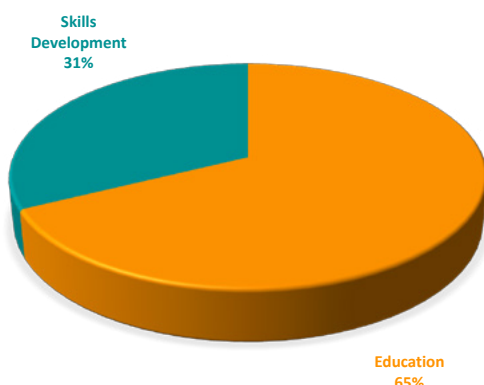

CERTIFICATION CEREMONY HONOURS READING ASSISTANTS

A certification ceremony celebrating the dedication and impact of eight reading assistants who played a vital role in improving literacy outcomes in Vryburg primary schools was held recently. The event brought together representatives from the Department of Education, school principals and Read Education Trust to recognise the assistants' commitment to learner development.

The programme supported 737 learners and 18 educators across three schools. Through consistent classroom support and guided reading activities, many learners improved their reading skills.

During the ceremony, the assistants received certificates of excellence and SACE-accredited certification. In addition, the programme opened pathways for employment and further study. One assistant shared how the experience inspired her to enrol for a Bachelor of Education in Foundation Phase, showing how the programme restored purpose, confidence and hope for the future.
