
The Hub is located at 45 De Kok Street and opens from 8 am to 4 pm. For more info, contact the Hub Manager, Charles, on 071 386 0065.

ECD **PROGRAMME**

13 ECD centres, within the Naledi community, have been selected to participate in a newly established Early Childhood Development (ECD) programme, aimed at facilitating and promoting children's access to quality ECD education and services.

This 12-month programme, implemented by the Early Care Foundation and Lunchbox Fund, will provide participants with accredited training and ensure practitioners are skilled to improve their classrooms and provide nutritional support to children, which impacts their holistic development and growth.

This initiative forms part of Waterloo Solar's flagship Early Childhood Development programme.



READING PROGRAMME



Seven youths, from communities within the Naledi Local Municipality, have been selected to participate in a Reading Programme, which will be introduced to schools during the third quarter of this year.
