PROVISION OF **READING RESOURCES**

In addition, the Hub aims to promote an interactive method of literacy by bringing together digital tools to keep learners excited.

This expo offered the learners an opportunity to engage with different institutions. It also allowed them to engage in individual personal assessments of their grade 11 and 12 academic marks in comparison to university requirements for the courses that they would like to pursue after high school.
